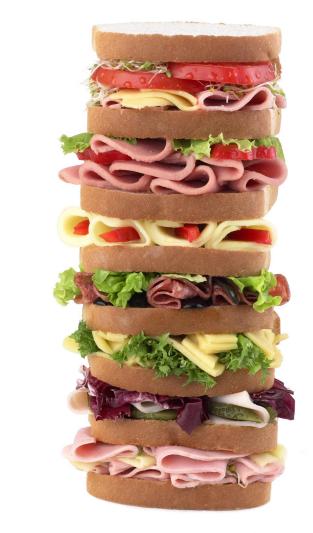

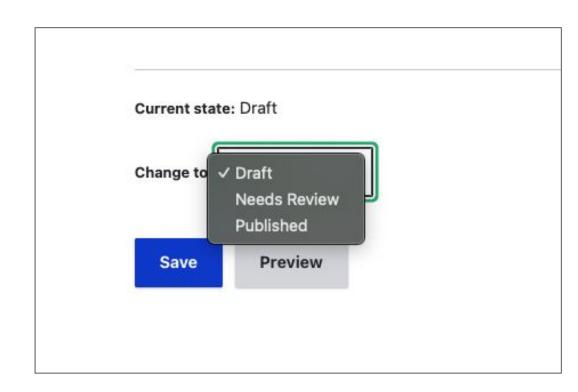

Governance Across Disciplines

Governance is the set of rules, processes, and protocols that define how an organization manages **the product**.

The product includes branding and technology which includes aspects of **design**, **code**, and **content**.

Why Governance Matters

- **Design** may feel too constrained, or that the product is not aligned with the brand.
- Development may feel the system is inconsistent.
- **Content creators** may feel the system is too limiting, or they have too much flexibility.

Finding Balance

- Will there be a single team managing the website?
- Will there be variations between websites?
- Are there processes in place for website updates?
- Who is financing the website?
- How do you handle one-off needs?

Finding Compromise

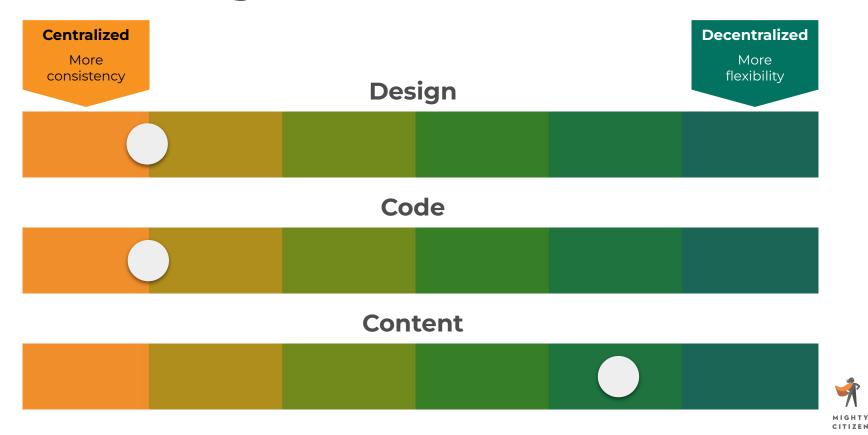
- **Diverse requirements** what are our core features?
- Conflicting priorities where can we be flexible?
- Individual customizations what can teams change without compromising the product?
- Evolving needs revisit governance process.

Recommended when you have multiple options for your page audiences to become aware of.



Accordion

Shows and hides lists of headings and content. Used to break up complex information into more digestible portions.



Content Grid

Used to display related ideas together in a group – can be used to display information without requiring a link.



Card Grid

Used to group short pieces of related information together and links to pages where users can learn more.



Quick Links

Used to display a group of related links together in a grid.



Logo Grid

Displays a group of logos in



Icon Grid

Cimilar to Contant Itam



Deadlines Grid

Display important upcoming dates by which your users must do or submit



Deadlines Grid - 2 column

Display two groups of important upcoming dates

Service Blueprint

A service blueprint is a detailed map of how a service works.

- Shows what students experience (frontstage)
- Reveals what staff, systems, and policies support that journey (backstage)
- Helps teams align and improve cross-campus services

Before Skinning, Identify:

- Which third-party sites should and can be skinned.
- This will require a lot of cooperation across departments.
- The limitations for each site.
 - Color changes only vs. fonts, imagery etc.
- Who is responsible for skinning each system: your team or the third-party.
- Timing for this process and if it will cause any delays.



Find Current Specs

You'll get this from your website traffic and hosting environment.

- Visitor analytics
 - Number of visitors and sessions per month
- Hard drive space
- RAM and CPU
- Monthly bandwidth

Don't forget to take into account regular activity and during traffic spikes!



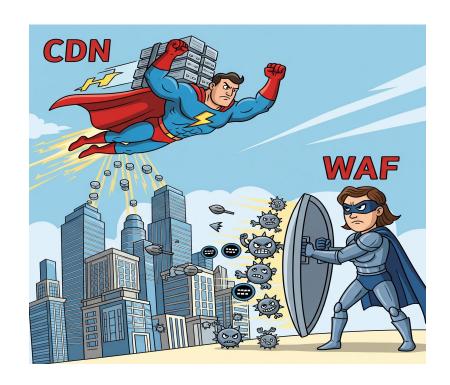

Search Data Requirements

- Data must be identified and accessible for indexing.
 - Search may need to aggregate content from multiple systems.
- Files (e.g., PDFs) should be indexed for full-text search.
- Access-controlled content requires secure handling.
 - Sensitive data should be protected within the search solution.
- Content may require categorization for filtered searches.
 - Custom metadata or tags may need to be added for indexing.

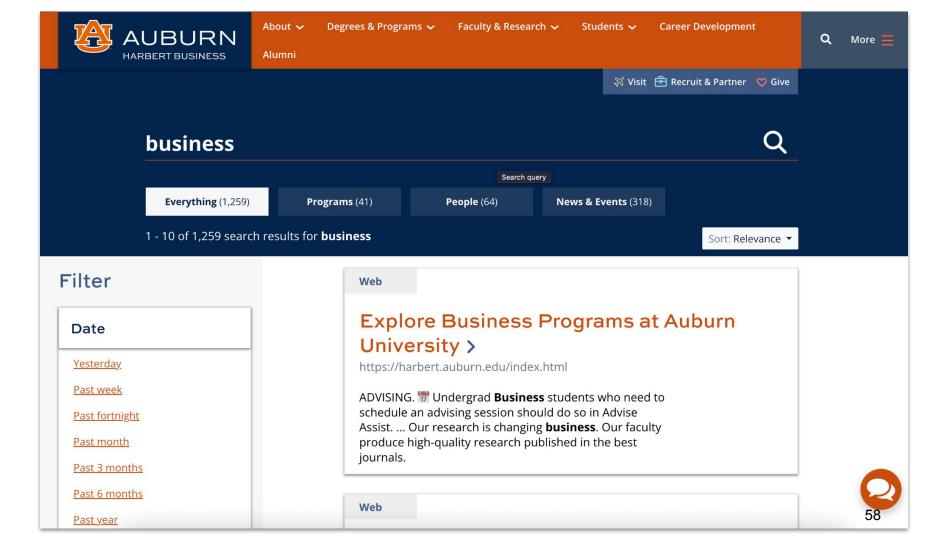


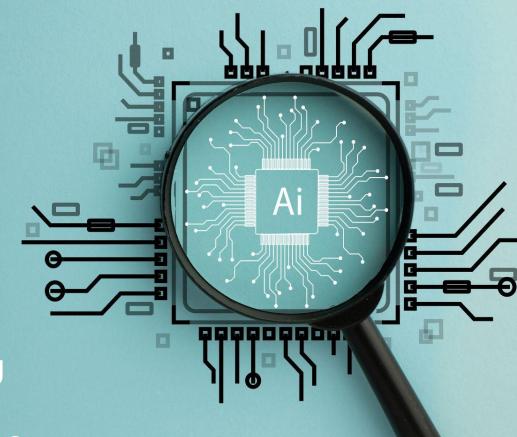
Search Provider Requirements

- Do you have budget for a third-party solution?

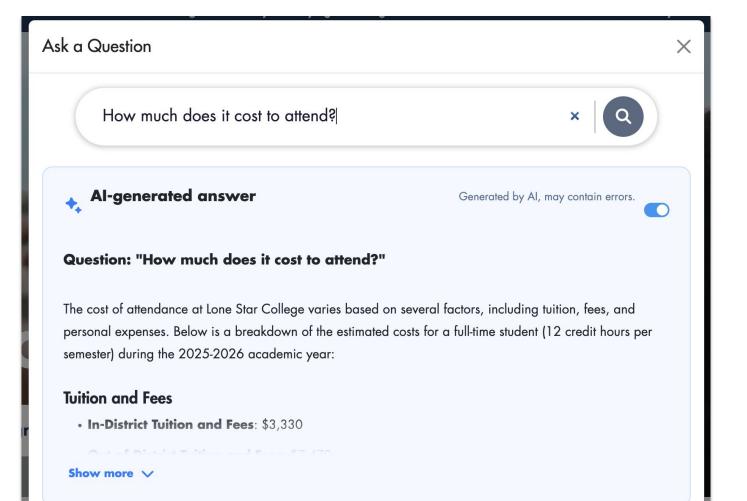








Al is quickly becoming expected and will be ubiquitous in the near future.



Possible Standards

- Browser compatibility
- Organizational security requirements or policies
- Privacy laws like HIPAA, GDPR, CCPA, etc
- Performance requirements or expectations







Accessibility

You should be thinking about accessibility from the very beginning of a new web project.

- Level of accessibility (WCAG AA minimum)
- Test to meet accessibility standards, including manual testing

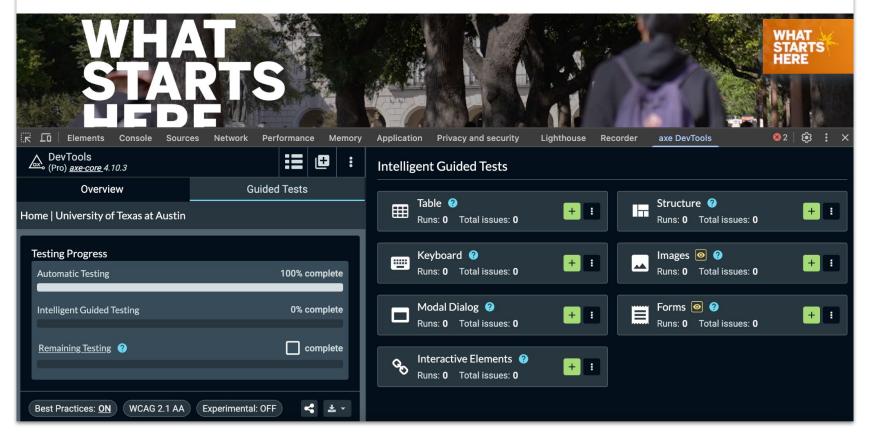

Key Takeaways

- → **Plan Content Migration:** Build a clear migration strategy; Assume old content won't all fit the new site.
- → **Establish Governance:** Define rules for content, design, and code management early.
- → Audit Integrations: List all third-party systems (CRM, LMS) and classify their connection complexity.
- → Ensure Scalable Hosting: Base new server needs on current traffic analytics and plan for spikes.
- → Prioritize Accessibility, Search, & AI: Aim for WCAG AA compliance and plan for robust, indexed search and future AI needs.
- → **Align Stakeholders:** Involve all departments early to break down silos and focus on the end-user experience.
